## The Game

Last week's draw placed the Rams away in a Sunday clash against Munakata Sanix Blues.

This scheduling meant a change in the usual training preparations. As a result, some early morning weights sessions at the beginning of the week and some vigorous hit-outs in double training days on Wednesday and Friday.



A captains run on Saturday completed a well-rounded training program and finished the Rams preparation for their weekend game.

This resulted in a 21-16 win in soggy conditions. Stand out performances contributing to this win were seen by Daniel Peters, Tamati Ellison and Takehiro Fujiwara. A man of the match performance saw fullback Peters score a try and provide the turning point which seemed to give Ricoh added momentum and the confidence they needed to see out the game.

When commenting on the game, Dan noted the platform set by the forwards in the set piece, particularly at scrum time as well as their defense. The coaches echoed this, in their comments noting that strong performances from Ellison at the breakdown and Fujiwara at scrum time allowed them to edge their opponents in the wet conditions; this allowed them to maintain the lead throughout the game.

An accurate kicking game provided by Colin Bourke as well coupled with the added impact of returning back rower Michael Broadhurst were also noted as key to the win.
